

Membership renewal

All memberships are due for renewal on 31 March 2018, unless you joined since 01 November 2017 in which case your membership is extended to 31 March 2019.

Membership fees

This year we have managed to find more savings available within the club's operating costs and are pleased to announce that we can pass that saving on to you by way of a further reduction in the annual membership fee to just £20.00 for the year!

New Direct Debits

If you have not previously set up a direct debit but would like to, then please remember to do so in advance of the renewal date. Direct debit forms can be downloaded from the Club website, or we can email one to you if you contact the Club Office. Unfortunately a bank requirement is that we do need a signed paper copy back by post please (not by email).

Existing direct debits

If you have already set up a direct debit, the payment will be taken in early April and your membership will renew automatically. If for any reason you do not wish to renew your membership, please remember to cancel your direct debit directly with your bank and let the Club Office know, as unfortunately we are unable to cancel the bank instruction on your behalf or reverse it once it has been paid.

Marty @ Goodwood

Here at MR2 Drivers' Club, we love to hear your stories about the adventures you and your motors have been getting up to. Here we get to hear about Matt & Jo Geerings Goodwood experience, along with "Marty", their rather fabulous MK1 and star of the photo shoot!

My Wife Jo & I celebrated our 5th Wedding Anniversary in September 2017. A traditional gift for a 5th anniversary is wood. We attended Goodwood Festival of Speed in the summer and discovered that the iconic house is open to the public on a few select days of the year. We felt that keeping with the theme for our anniversary and as wood is in the title, we will visit Goodwood House and take Marty, our Mk1 MR2.

Goodwood House is near Chichester in West Sussex. We booked in advance for a tour of the iconic house and afternoon tea. It was a really enjoyable experience and at only £25 per person, I would highly recommend.

On arrival, we drove through the gates at the bottom of the world famous hill climb and made our way up the hill. It was hard to avoid temptation to do a standing start on the start line. The start line is a permanent one, made out of bricks, supplied from the famous brickyard at the Indianapolis Circuit in the USA.

I couldn't resist a standing start and accelerated hard from 0mph through the gears up to 3rd gear. I then settled the revs as other vehicles were nearby and I wanted to be safe. Now we knew how it felt to pull away at the Goodwood F.O.S start line!



Once I had driven past the house, I was able to park in the car park. To our surprise this is usually the paddock at F.O.S. No exotic cars in the paddock today though. The MR2 is by far the best car in the paddock.

A few weeks before our visit, I had decided to enquire if it would be possible to get a picture of Marty in front of the House. I have been attending Goodwood F.O.S since 1994 and this was a paradise for me. After several E-mails to a PR Executive for the Goodwood Estate, it was agreed that we could take some pictures of Marty (My Mk1) outside the famous house.

Once parked up, I was greeted and escorted to the front of the house by my contact. At this point, I was already aware from the E-mails that Goodwood have a strict photography policy and certain rules had to be obeyed. As soon as Marty was parked in position, Jo began taking many photos.



When we had finished, we were directed back to the car park and then invited inside the house. Immediately we began our tour. The tour was very informative and the tour guide was very knowledgeable. But, that said, it was probably a good thing in the long run as so many people could get up on the dance floor and boogie along with the Party Popperz all night long!

Keeping the 30+ car convoy tail unbroken proved a bit of a challenge but we did a pretty good job of it and arrived at Duxford in good order and managed to fill our designated parking area and put on a superb display of MR2's with each marque well represented:





The day at Duxford was simply brilliant. So much to see and learn: one day for a first time visitor is just not enough to take it all in. Some of the exhibits on show really are breath-taking and will be hard to see anywhere else Parts of an Iraqi Supergun, a B52 Bomber, Concorde Prototype, salvaged sections of the 911 Twin Towers' steelwork it goes on!

Plus a host of static planes to get aboard on look inside and for those REALLY wanting to take things further, pleasure flights were operating (deep pockets required for the Spitfire though)!







Sadly, the day had to end eventually And so it was the end of the AGM Weekend 2018. The positive reports we have received from a lot of people confirms that a good time was had by all and we look forward to seeing what next years event has in store!







We are required to publish a transcript of the AGM proceedings for those members who were not able to attend in person.

Opening Address: Steve Tudor (Chairman)

Hello ladies and gentlemen and welcome to this, the 26th AGM. Firstly, can I point out some house keeping rules :

- Please ensure that all mobile phones are off or on silent
- In the unlikely event tha there is a fire, the emergency exit is by the door we entered the room and back through the foyer into the carpark which is the Fire Assembly point. Fire marshall will then meet all guests.



To make best use of time and allow time for vote counting, the Meeting will as usual be in 3 parts:-

FORMAL PART :

Consisting of the AGM reports from the directors

COFFEE BREAK – TO ALLOW TIME FOR :

Final votes to be cast Vote counting Coffee

INFORMAL PART :

Vote Results Any other business Open Forum

So, to explain the procedures involved in this AGM:

- Only fully paid up members may participate and vote
- Anyone wishing to address the meeting please indicate by raising your hand. If called
 stand and announce your name and region
- Only one chance to speak on any one subject in the interests of time and to give all an equal chance

Each Director will take questions at the end of their report - only on matters in their report. All other questions must wait until the open forum.

Hopefully that explains the format of the meeting and I will now hand over to Nik Milford to begin the directors reports.

Finance Report

We finally sorted access to the bank accounts and that's been running smoothly for a few months now. I spent some time going through last year's entries to produce the accounts and this year's are being done day to day, so it's much easier now things are back up to date. We have broadly broken even over the year, with our historic cash balance of around £20k remaining in place.

After sorting the accounts as first priority, I then went through to try to understand where our key costs are and what we can cut in order to survive with a smaller membership and reduce membership fees as much as we can. The key areas of savings we've identified and acted on this year are:



The website.

The previous provider charged a £250 annual fee plus £70 a month, so about £1,100. The new provider charged a one-off set-up cost of £650, then £20 a month ongoing, so an annual saving of £850, which is about 10% of our membership fees.

The storage unit.

For many years the Club has had a central storage unit for items such as the carpet tiles and flags etc used at the NEC. Whilst it's been very useful, fundamentally it was storing items for use at one or two shows a year for one Region and not practically available for anyone else. Historically the cost was around £250, which wasn't unreasonable, but this has increased substantially over the last few years to £650 last year and a proposal of over £1,200 for this year! This was totally out of the question, so we have emptied the unit and cancelled the contract, giving us another significant annual saving.

Directors.

Definitely not an intentional financial planning technique, but one of the upsides of not having enough Directors is that we've had fewer expenses, as there has been much less travelling to meetings. The last meeting took place by Skype, which was a first for us, and we hope to repeat that going forward to enable us to meet sort of face-to-face more often but without incurring more expenses. This will also cut out my 7 hour round trip drive to meetings, which will free up even more time to do more crappy admin.

As of last year, we cut the AGM to Saturday night only, with the group activity on Sunday rather than Saturday morning. This makes it half the cost to attend and easier for those who have work commitments on Friday to attend without missing out, whilst fitting just as much into the weekend as we always did.

Log Book

Another unintentional saving, but obviously with fewer issues we've had some reduced costs, albeit that the issues we have produced have been twice as thick! Going forward these should return to quarterly but we're looking at alternative printing quotes to cut some costs and lead times there too.

As well as ensuring things aren't costing more than necessary, we also need to ensure that we're not doing anything we don't need to: for example, not buying large stocks of Regalia which we then carry around for the next 10 years! These days everything moves more quickly and many companies accept single item orders which are produced and delivered very quickly, so we're moving more to items which are made individually to order rather than spending money on stock that we might be left with. Similarly we're trying to make sure we don't lose money on events such as the AGM, for example by negotiating lower room numbers and better pricing. We have managed to keep the AGM prices roughly the same for 3 years now, despite significant rises in hotel costs.

Once we've exhausted all the cost-cutting we can, we'll focus on where we can get more income. Although we have some new Regalia lines that are proving popular, we're really not aiming to make much profit out of Regalia - it's more to provide a service to Members and advertise the Club. So to increase income, our focus will be looking at increased advertising - in Log Book, possibly sponsorship of the National Day, maybe website advertisers etc - and of course increasing member numbers.

Given all of the above, we're very happy to announce a further reduction in the membership fee to £20. That's reduced from £35 in 2015, to £25 in 2016, to £20 in 2017 - a drop of more than 42% in 3 years. Anyone joining from today will get membership to 31 March 2019, so 17 months for £20 - bargain! Those of us renewing at 31 March will renew at £20.

So in summary, we've made some great progress in cutting costs. There are a couple of items still to work on, but the focus will move to increasing revenues from advertising and new memberships. I'd like to thank Mike Gooding, our previous Finance Director, for all his help well beyond the cut-off date he wanted to finish!

Membership

As of this morning we have 371 registered members, compared to 350 this time last year and 301 the year before, so again good progress being made but plenty of scope to do more.

We need to work harder at retaining new members, as a large proportion of those who don't renew are people who have joined in the last 2 years. Improvements in eLogBook and Log Book frequency, and quicker communication of new members to the relevant Regional Coordinators, will hopefully help that.

If we could ask you all to help too by making events open and welcome to new members, which generally means holding them in public places rather than at individuals' houses please, as home meetings are much more likely to be too intimidating for anyone new to sign up for.

Personnel

Steve will talk in more detail about personnel.

We're doing a bit better for volunteers, partly by getting more organised & efficient with tasks, which is a key focus for us now that the website is sorted.

We have Website Brian, Admin Ann & hopefully the two new Directors.

We still need Regional Coordinators for Scotland, the Borders and Wales and maybe some help for poor Mags in the North who has to dart back & forth from her home in the North West! We could also do with a younger member to focus on trying to attract some younger owners to join, but again more on that later.

Regalia

We've got a few new lines this year, which are proving popular.

Steve came up with the new red jackets & these have been very popular – they really help to identify our members and stand at events and make us look professional.

Travel mugs are also a new addition and have been very welcome at some of the colder, rainier shows for warming hands!

We've recently started offering car mats, which are available in a range of carpet and trim colours, for Mk1, Mk2 & Mk3. We've got samples here today, so you can have a look and we have the website available so can help place orders for anyone who wants to.

We've also arranged a discount on Heritage car covers. There are a few key items in our web site shop, but there is a much wider range on the Heritage website so if you see anything else on there that you like the look of, just give us a shout and we should be able to get it for you at a discounted price.

Log Book

Not much to say on this - I find myself apologising again for being behind with them, but there are only so many hours in the day and as you can see from the number of reports with my name against them, I've had my hands full!

Darren is taking over from now on, so hopefully they will be back on track to quarterly soon.

eLogBook

Richard Davies wanted to step down from doing this and we'd had a lot of feedback that the format wasn't very user-friendly and the cc list was very out of date, so we decided to take a break, re-think the format and re-launch it with the new website.

I drafted up a new format which everyone was happy with and Admin Ann has now kindly taken over responsibility for drafting it each month and getting it sent out.

Website

Finally! This has been a long time coming – the old site was problematic, didn't work well on modern devices and as already mentioned was costing us an arm and a leg.

At last year's indoor show in Manchester I was approached by someone - now well known to us as Website Brian - who specialises is websites for classic car clubs. He had a brief presentation with him which he showed me on the day. Given that we'd been talking about this for as long as I can remember, I took this to the rest of the Board and invited him to our next Board meeting, where he won everyone over with his helpfulness, technical expertise and of course most importantly he was cheap! With invaluable help from Chris, Brian got the site ready and trained up Admin Ann and I to be able to populate much of it ourselves without adult supervision. Steve & Darren will also be able to add things directly once they get a chance to arrange a training session from Brian.

Our next focus will be populating the member discounts page and setting up a member gallery. Many thanks to Chris, who like Mike has continued to help us long after he wanted to step back. Chris was an invaluable middle-man between Website Brian and the rest of us luddites when designing and populating the new site - hopefully he is now enjoying a little peace from us at last!

Facebook

We've got 2,276 members on our page. I think activity on the page has been much better in recent months, so hopefully this will help encourage some of the online members to join the Club.

I know many of you in this room may dislike or be wary of Facebook, but it really is unbeatable in terms of interacting with a large number of people very quickly. Without pestering the various other MR2 Facebook groups, we wouldn't have half the attendees at the National Day and other events like the recent Epsom Eastbourne run, where the local Coordinator asked me to post the event on Facebook and attendance jumped from 10 to 30 within three days.

Well I think that's me finally done, so I'll hand over to Darren.

Promotions Report

Hi and welcome to my section where I talk about the promotional side of what's been going on behind the scenes.

Firstly, apologies for my absence from last years AGM slight case of a work emergency that just had to be dealt with so hopefully, all is forgiven.

So, from a promotional side, you will almost certainly all be aware of the new website that has been developed and that went live during the summer. I'm sure you will all agree that this is a vast improvement on what went before in terms of ease of navigation, up to date information and generally being a fresher looking site.



We have received a lot of good comments about the new look which is always great to hear, however, there may still be tweaks along the way as things get found during continued usage. So, if anyone does spot a flaw, please do feel free to let us know so we can amend where needs be we have tried to cover all bases but your feedback is always welcome to help us make the site even better.

What also helps keeping the site looking current and fresh is your updates. So, the likes of the photos and reports from events attended, the more of this we receive, the more we can get uploaded and it helps us to demonstrate that we are active in numerous areas around the country and very often during the season.

The other huge benefit from getting this website up and running is that we have now been able to take control of the site ourselves rather than being reliant on a third party who were, to be frank, not very reliable, but also quite expensive. So as a double whammy, it is going to prove cheaper and easier for us to self maintain which can only be a good thing.

Something we would like to add to the website is a short video giving an insight to the clubs activities. We have a template to use which effectively collates many 5 second clips into a seamless montage of about 90 seconds in length but we do need the "5 second clips" content so if anyone has any dashcam footage that we may be able to use, please let us know and we will get to work on putting this together. The clips could be shots taken whilst traveling in convoy to an event (ie: tomorrow if anyone wants to take up the challenge), clips from static shows, social events, racing clips anything that is club related. With your help, we can put a good presentation together and have this available to view via website and social media. Plus, it would also be a great thing to have running on the screen when we are at the big indoor shows like the NEC, just to add a touch of finesse.

So, if you would like to help contribute content, or even assist with the production, find me later and let me know.

As a final comment regarding the website, a lot of emphasis has gone into keeping a matching "brand" running through the site. When we say "brand", we are referring to the current club logo, font types, imagery, colouring etc. This is something we are trying to make sure is kept consistent through all variants of club appearance. You will already notice that the elogbook that comes out carries this theme through along with any club documents that you will see. The purpose of this is to try and make the club instantly recognisable to all.

To that end, we really do need any of the old style literature / banners / flags etc to be handed in, amnesty style !! you won't lose what you have, we will simply replace anything out of date with a like for like but sporting the current club imagery. Your help with this will be much appreciated.

OK, enough about website so moving on

Logbook for my sins, I will be taking over the role of logbook editor from now. We had a chat and agreed that it probably makes sense for me to pick this up as it goes hand in hand with trying to raise some revenues from advertisers and is also another publicity tool.

I'm sure you will agree that Nik has done a great job with this over the last few years and I only hope I can keep it up to the standards set.

I know it is not an easy task to put this together so it would be a good time for me to ask you all for some content Anything you feel might be interesting for other club members to read or know about. Or if anyone has any suggestions or features you would like us to consider, just let us know.

In the last edition, it was great to see some new contributors. Niccola's coverage of the German trip was a really good article.

Have to say though that my own personal favourite was the 90's article produced by David Blackburn. That really was something quite different to what has been done in the past and was a great read. I think that this format does work well to remind us what the world was like "back in the day" and what has going on when these cars were current models.

So whilst we can put the work into creating some of the content, quite often the best ideas come from outside the box. You might well have seen something done in other magazines or by other clubs that we could Erm Borrow ?

Im all ears so if you have anything in mind, find me later and through it at me and I will see what can be made to work.

In terms of national exposure. we have made some good associations with members of the motoring press this year. Off the back of that, we have managed to get a full page spread in the Modern Classics magazine who covered our National Day for us – and a couple of the stars from that coverage are with us tonight – you know who you are so feel free to take a bow. Autographs later!

We have also had a few club members who have taken part in other magazine photo shoots where marque specific features have been done with multi page articles in various publications.

We do get approached by certain magazines to nominate someone with a particular example from time to time. When that happens, we put the word out to those suitable but naturally, only those who are paid up members. If you get the call, it would be great if you could make sure the club gets a mention when they put their words to the pictures. Again, it's all good press.

And coupled with these associations, we have managed to keep the club stand at the NEC Classic next month and awaiting confirmation of a place at the restoration show in March. Anyone who has been to these will know what good events they are and that they always generate a lot of interest. And being there puts us amongst some pretty well known people.

Now, one thing that we are trying to arrange for the National Day next year is a celebrity appearance from someone very well known in the motoring world. I'm going to leave it dangling there for the time being as it is a long shot but we do potentially have a meeting lined up with said celebrity at the NEC next month so hopefully that would be some news that we can announce around Xmas / early next year. I'm sure you will agree that this would be quite a scoop for the club and would help to fill the field at Hatton with MR2's from far and wide.

OK: new recruits We have nominated 2 new directors to the club which you are being asked to vote on. Both guys have been approached to help us develop the club further with a real purpose.

David and his knowledge within Toyota and the media circles is something we are looking to abuse. His previous input from outside the club has been invaluable for the last 3 years. David has managed to get us plenty of freebies and goodies courtesy of Toyota although I think a GT86 could well be off limits next year some of us will know the reason why!

Scott's input would be quite different to David's, however, it will be a good opportunity to expand the club presence out to a wider audience. Whilst this might not float everyone's boat, we do have to accept that expanding the club does mean appealing to a different demographic.

On that note, we did have an interesting suggestion from Les Fletcher who had noted how another club was introducing youth into their ranks by way of a junior membership: whilst the logistics of bringing the same thinking across to ourselves may prove a stretch with our current resources, certainly the thinking is right in that we could and should have an offering that appeals to the younger generation. To that end, we would be interested to hear from anyone who moves in these circles who might be interested in helping us to make the club more appealing to the younger crowd.

With this being said, we are not saying that the club will change from what you already know and enjoy. That will remain intact as the core of the club, but it does mean adding a new dimension that can help us to attract new members. So those who enjoy the country and classic shows will still have these available as the backbone of the annual calendar. That won't change.

What will change is that we will be looking to link up with IMOC with Scott's help and start attending the "festival" type events such as Japfest, JAE and Japshow. I'm sure you know what type of events these are and whether they appeal or not will come down to personal preference. Like I said, it won't appeal to everyone but, crucially, it is an addition to the calendar rather than a replacement so if it's not for you, there is nothing lost in terms of other shows to attend which do appeal to you.

The reason for getting these on the 2018 calendar is to get in front of the much wider MR2 community and to try and encourage more unity across the various MR2 clubs.

We have seen from the National Days that there are a LOT of MR2 drivers who are not members. Bringing more of these over to the club helps us to keep the membership costs falling : more of which Nik will explain.

So for those of you who are not keen on these events, you have nothing to worry about other than your membership fee possibly falling.

Well, that's pretty much all from me. As I mentioned earlier, please feel free to give me your idea's / thoughts on what you would like to see in future log books or any other comments you wish to share.

I'll be the one propping up the bar later so you might be best to catch me early this evening, or best leave it till the morning !!

Shows Report

With Bryan stepping down at last years AGM we had some big shoes to fill.....not literally of course.

We decided at board level to take a fresh look at how we present the club at major shows, how the stands are laid out etc.

Firstly we decided that as the NEC has decent flooring (unlike other arenas) we would move the usual "show tiles" up to the NW region for them to use.

There were two driving forces behind this. Firstly it allowed the club to get rid of the costly storage unit, as Dave Hall and Graham Milligan kindly agreed to store the tiles with the ones they already have with the rest of the show equipment either being scrapped as it was dated or damaged or shared between Darren, Graham and Dave and myself.



Secondly when looking around the stands at the NEC the majority of clubs including major ones like the RSOC don't put anything down anyway so again this helped with the decision.

In fact we trialled the "no carpet" approach before taking the final decision at the Practical Classics in March and none of the clubs members attending actually noticed until it was pointed out.

All of this went along way to reducing the clubs overheads, especially considering the storage company wanted to increase their fees by £50/month and as previously stated by Nik this has helped us to potentially bring the membership fees down to hopefully an even more attractive price to try and encourage more members to join without losing benefits.

We have also over the last show season developed a list of circa 10 -15 cars which we can hopefully draw on to show the Club in its best light at the major indoor shows such as the NEC.

These range from the heavily modified to the usual concours / standard cars to try and reflect that the club isn't just for the standard cars and that we openly embrace modified or mildly modified cars and include some of the cars we have used at shows in the past.

Again the idea is to keep the stand as fresh as possible. Plus the modified cars draw in people anyway.

All owners have been approached and made aware of the commitment required especially for shows like the NEC.

We also trialled a display screen (kindly loaned by Darren) at the Practical Classics on which we display photos from club events.

This also seemed to work and draw people to the stand pop up (another change) where we could talk to them about the benefits of joining us.

Going forward we're also thinking of trying to get a promotional video made to again show the club in its best light for use at all major shows and also on the new website.

So if anyone can help with this or knows someone who could then please let the board know. Also if anyone has any video in car or otherwise from club events that we could use and you are willing to let us use again please let us know.

So onto the 2017 National Events

As I eluded to earlier in this report we entered the Practical Classics and Restoration Show for the first time in the clubs history at NEC at the end of March the beginning of April

We had 4 cars on the club stand. Leon Howell's Mk2 Turbo, Darren Letts Mk2 Rev 5, Simon McMurray's Roadster and I displayed this year.

Leons car was featured in a recent logbook and is heavily modified. It had in fact only been fully resprayed a couple of days before the show and quite a few people commented they could actually smell the fresh paint.

This show has only been around for a couple of years and appears to be a great show with everything from Traction Engines to Barn Find Auctions and clubs are actively encouraged to work on cars at the show.

We also had a stand visit by Fuzz Townsend of Car SOS fame. Much to the annoyance of the MX5 OC who were trying to get him on their stand. Fuzz obviously has good taste in coming to see us first.

We also had a lot of public interest in the cars to the point where they were queueing 2 or 3 deep to talk to us on the Saturday.

The show is also a great fit in the clubs show calendar as with the Lancaster Classic in November it book ends the show season

The Next National Event on the calendar was the actual National Day itself

Held again at Hatton Country World around 160 cars attended with all marques being well represented.

This year following feedback from people last year we tried to attract some trade stands. Eventually we managed to get Roque Motorsport and MR2 Ben signed up.

AutoGlym and Toyota again supported us with AutoGlym supplying the prizes for the different show n shine type class winners and Toyota by providing a GT86 for us to use in the Gymkhana along with Toyota Gazoo Racing goodies for the raffle.

Combined both these events raised £249 for the NSPCC.

Unfortunately unlike the Birthday Bash the weather wasn't as kind to us this year with the prize giving and the shows breakdown being done with the rain coming down at 45 degrees.

The Coast to Coast in Yorkshire followed a couple of weeks later with the usual Annual German Trip in July with a couple of new faces joining the usual crowd.

So to bring the year to an end we will again be supporting the NEC Lancaster Classic between the 10th and 12th of November.

We're in Hall 5 Stand 5-428 which is not far from Hall 5's main entrance. We will be exhibiting 4 cars. These will be Mike Jackson and Les Fletchers Mk1's, my 10th Anniversary and Simon McMurrays roadster.

Your more than welcome to come and join us and say hello.

At this point I'd like to say a big thank you to all the Clubs Regional Coordinators for their efforts over the past 12 months. Over the course of the year the clubs regions have organised a total of over 90 events between them excluding National ones which I'm sure you'll agree is a fantastic effort.

So that was 2017 and I guess you'll want to know what's being planned on a National level in 2018.

We have already applied to have a stand again at the Practical Classics show in March, dates for the diary are 23-25 of March. We should know if our application has been successful by the end of the year.

We have also been approached by Patrick Mortell of Rogue Motorsport who is also the MR2 Championship Organiser to help celebrate the 10^{th} anniversary of the 750MC MR2 Championship..

I'm sure whatever is planned will involve a days racing watching that is not participating.

Details of this are still in the planning stage so please watch this space

Another couple of shows we feel the Club should have a presence at are JAPFEST and JAE.

JAPFEST is usually in April at Silverstone and Donnington in July with JAE at the end of August/beginning of September. IMOC, MR2OC and Two Brutal attend these events so hence the reasoning behind feeling we should have a presence to.

So if you would be interested in supporting the club at any of these 3 shows then please let me know.

We are also planning another National Day.

Again it will be at Hatton as this really ticks all the boxes in terms of location, facilities and hire cost. It will be the same weekend as the past 2 years so the 3^{rd} of June is the date to put in your diaries.

One idea we have had going forward is to combine the National Day with the club AGM but this will be something for the future if it goes ahead. This is in the early stages of planning feasibility at the moment.

To make this happen we would need more support in terms of organising the National as currently we do the show set up on the Saturday which would clash with the actual AGM meeting. Also we have some breathing space between the National and the AGM as it stands hence the need for additional resource to bring the events together.

We would need to coordinate two venues, along with dates. With June being prime "wedding time" this may well be a couple of years away yet.

It also has the advantage of potentially saving members the cost of two hotel stays if the events are combined.

I know other clubs take this approach but as I say its in its infancy at the moment.

So that concludes the 2017 shows report so if there are any questions on this subject please feel free to ask them now

Editors Note: A word for word account of the questions raised at this stage was not recorded, however, the main query centred on the prospect of combined AGM and National Day in the future. The general opinion was that this proposal would not be favourable with the club members. In order to see a visual representation of peoples views, a snap vote was called with a show of hands "for" and "against" the proposal. The outcome was a unanimous vote AGAINST the proposal so the existing format will remain unchanged with the National Day and the AGM weekend being held as separate events, at different times to each other.

Update on changes throughout the year

We left the last AGM asking for volunteers and can I firstly say a big thank you to everyone who did step up to the plate. Some unfortunately didn't have the skills we were looking for and as such we didn't take you up on your kind offers of help.

One person we did get to join us was Ann Campbell or as she is now known by many as Admin Ann. Ann has been helping throughout the year set up the new website and has been instrumental in getting eLogbook up and running again. So a big thank you to Ann for all her hard work to date.

Also Richard Pells stepped up to become a Director. As many of you know Richard had done a fantastic job with the SE Region and was a good fit to the board. Unfortunately Richard stepped down after one board meeting for personal reasons and has now moved to the SW selling his MR2 and leaving the club in the process. To that end Alan Cayzer stepped into the breach and took over the running of the SE and has taken on the batten from Richard.

We have also had a change in the North Mids region with Ann and Steve Loffmann taking over from Lynn and Tony Gardner who also stepped down shortly after the last AGM.

With Richard stepping down we were still in need of more directors and it is with great pleasure that I welcome David Crouch and Scott Barton to the board.

David as many of you know works for Toyota GB and is joining the board as a Non Executive Director. For those of you that don't know Scott is a also a director of IMOC and is the guy who always wins the Modified class at the National Day with his black MK2 Turbo.

We have also had a bit of a reshuffle with the roles between the current board members. Nik is stepping down as editor of logbook to focus on the financial side of things. Darren will taking on logbook editing as well as expanding his current role to try and get the club more exposure in the Classic magazines. I will be taking on the Shows Role vacated by Bryan last year.

David will in his Non exec role be supporting us as a club and will be providing an objective voice in the way we plan to move things forward and Scott will be bringing new ideas into the melting pot with his experience of other MR2 clubs and events.

As many of you will also now be aware we relaunched the club website earlier this summer. Hopefully the new site will bring us bang up to date in terms of layout and be much easier for us to control and change as and when we need to.

If you haven't had a look at it please do as I hope you'll be pleasantly surprised. There are still some areas we need to work on especially in the member only section but as a gateway to the club and what we are all about then I think it works well.

As usual if you feel you can bring something to the club then please let one of the board know. We are always looking for volunteers to help lighten the load on the rest of us. So please help out. It can be very frustrating at times but it can also be very rewarding as well.

Editors Note: A fully word for word account of the questions and answers was not recorded, however, the following represents a generalisation of the queries raised and the responses.

"Proposed Membership Discount for Younger Members"

The idea was suggested that the club could consider a discounted membership for younger members.

The club had been approached about this previously (and Les Fletcher was acknowledged during the reports section for putting the idea forward). Any scheme that encourages new members to join is a good thing, however, having given this prior consideration, the logistics of policing this scheme with our current resources would prove very difficult to administer. Our current thinking is to get the membership fees down for all. The benefits new members gain is the extended period of "annual" membership fee in their first year which can be anything up to 5 months of free membership. This is a straight forward scheme to administer and would be the clubs preferred introductory scheme until such time that extra resources are available to review again.

"Membership Cards"

The point was raised as to whether the membership cards are necessary and could they be omitted to help reduce costs further.

The club will look into the savings that could be made by omitting the membership card but would suspect that the saving offered would be minimal and it may prove that members would rather retain the card and the cost to keep the card as personal collectors items. Further information will be gathered and options proposed in the near future.

"Non MR2 Owners being Club members"

A point was raised about a non MR2 owner being a Club member. The current club rules appear to exclude such individuals from being Club members.

The board were unaware that such a ruling was still in existence, however, with the decline in MR2 numbers on the road and the preference for increasing membership numbers, such a ruling would have no benefit in being upheld. As such, with the agreement of the members, we will amend the club rules and omit any such outdated clauses which place restrictions in the way of allowing new members to join the Club.

"Tyre availability to suit standard OEM 15" wheels"

The query was raised where to find tyres to suit the standard 15" wheels as numerous retailers were unable to help saying that the sizes were now obsolete.

Various responses were offered in reply: essentially, they are still available albeit, not readily so at your local tyre centre. A good way to find these for future reference would be: www.mytyres.co.uk

"Club Image to embrace all MR2"

The point was made that some people are reluctant to participate in certain events or contribute to articles as they don't believe their car is of high enough quality to be considered.

A good point, well made. It is natural that this scene will always attract people who like to show their very best and "dress to impress", however, the Club should be more than just a showcase of the prime examples. ALL MR2's are welcomed into the club and more often than not, those that are carrying the most miles and scars have the best stories to tell! We would love to hear from anyone who's car has a tale to tell: show us what it's like, tell us how it got to where it is now, what it means to you to own it and to drive it. There are a couple of MR2's in the club that are notorious and always garner a lot of attention and by their owners admission, they won't ever be winning "best in show" but that's not what it's all about!

"Talking to People at Shows"

Not so much a question to answer but more of a general statement. Barry Cowland made the point that people shouldn't be afraid to talk to people who look at your car when showing at events. Having been at events where Barry & Joy have displayed their fantastic mk1, it is always refreshing to hear the enthusiasm in Barry's patter when he is talking to people about his car and the marque in general. The point Barry makes is that the person looking has a similar interest, get talking to them and enjoy the experience.

"Non Executive Director Role?"

The question was asked as to how a Non Executive Director differs from a Director.

The differences were explained that a Non Executive Director (NED) is someone who is invited into Board meetings (where key decisions are made) to act in an advisory role only. A NED does not have any authority to enforce an action but is there to provide an impartial and informed opinion to the Board members.

Under the club rules, only paid up members of the Club are eligible to be Board members. With the individual in question, as a direct employee of Toyota, club membership could be seen as a conflict of interest so joining the club would not be an option. In this situation, a NED role would allow us to benefit from David's experience and his association within Toyota without compromising his position, whilst still allowing attendance at the Board meetings.

"What are the Articles of Association"

With one of the items to be voted on being the amendment to the Articles of Association, clarification was asked as to what this relates to.

Essentially, this is a repeat of the item which had been voted in favour of at the previous AGM but had missed the allocation at Companies House in the required time frame. This vote was a formality to allow us to log at Companies House.

The articles are the rules which we must follow to ensure that we are acting in the interests of the Club at all times. As it happens, one of the changes in the articles is to allow us to change rules where the Club can benefit without the need for majority membership voting. A good example has already been seen of this "Only MR2 owners can be members" rule being changed.

"Data Protection Ruling"

The query was raised regarding the imminent changes to the Data Protection Rules and was the club aware of the changes required.




The events you guys have attended looked great and varied with some excellent reports being provided which we're sure the rest of the club will enjoy reading about.
